Enjoy the Shikoku pilgrimage route in Awa city

What is the Shikoku Henro?

This is a 1,200-kilometer pilgrimage route around the island of Shikoku that consists of eighty-eight Buddhist temples as well as numerous other religious and historical sites. It is believed to have been founded by the well-known Buddhist priest Kūkai (774-835, posthumously known as Kōbō Daishi). This pilgrimage is open to all, regardless of social status or background. Some make this journey in memory of someone who has passed away, some for self-reflection, and some for the fulfillment of a prayer etc. It does not matter what order you visit the temples, nor how you make the journey. You can visit all of the sites in one go or in segments. You can start at any temple along the route, but many people start at Temple 1 Ryozenji in Tokushima prefecture.

Visiting the temples in Awa City



In Awa city, you can visit four of the eighty-eight temples along the Shikoku pilgrimage route. That are in close proximity. The roads that link them are relatively flat and easy to walk, so this area is an excellent place to `warm up` for the rest of the journey. An attractive feature of the route through Awa city is that there are many opportunities to communicate and interact with the local people.











The stairs of Aizen Hall, where Aizen Myoo is enshrined, are for different wishes. Go on the left if you want to have a relationship with someone, go to the right if you want to end a relationship. Don't make a mistake!

Temple 7: [Jūrakuji]

Kōbō Daishi founded this temple and gave it this name because he wanted to take away the ten forms of suffering and to provide ten forms of enjoyment (jūraku) to all people. People come here to pray they can find a partner to marry or to cure eye problems or for the souls of babies and children.



Temple 8: **[Kumadaniji]**

The main gate, built in 1687, is the largest among the eighty-eight temples, and the two-storied Tahoto (treasure tower), built in 1774, is the oldest in Shikoku. This temple is also well-known for its flowers, such as ajisai (hydrangeas) and hachisuka sakura (cherry blossom).

A Kuma-mamori (bear amulet) named after the temple is believed to protect you from disasters.





Temple 9: 【Hōrinji】

This temple is surrounded by rice fields and is the only temple along the Shikoku pilgrimage with the main statue in a reclining position, called Nehan-zo. In the main hall, there are many straw sandals that have been made by people who pray for strong, healthy legs and/or feet. At the temple office you can buy small ashi-koshi onegai waraji (straw sandals wishing [for good] feet and back).

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This unusually shaped pagoda, located about 60 steps above the temple grounds, was built in 1607 for Sumiyoshi Shrine in Osaka, but was moved here in 1873.

Temple 10: [Kirihataji]

In this area, Kōbō Daishi met a woman who was weaving, and she provided him with a piece of the finest cloth for his worn robe. For her generous deed, she obtained enlightenment and turned in a statue of Kannon, which can be seen on the temple grounds after climbing up 333 steps from the main gate.

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Other places of interest

Inunohaka Daishidō [Ichiba-cho Inunohaka Ōkita, Awa city]

There is a story about Kūkai and the village Inunohaka, which is located between Kirihataji and Temple 88, Ōkuboji. It is believed that when he was walking up a mountain with his dog a wild boar attacked them. The dog defended Kūkai but fell into a waterfall by accident and died. Kūkai felt pity for the dog and built a grave at the site, which he called "Inu no haka" (dog`s grave). Later, the local

people created a small building and placed a statue of Kūkai and a dog here. As well, for a long time people from several nearby homes have been taking turns daily to offer tea and flowers at this place.





Hirai Omizu Daishi [37 Yoshida Hirai Donari-cho, Awa city]



Between Jūrakuji and Kumadaniji there is a well related to an old tale. A long time ago, a shabby-looking monk went to a house and asked the owner for some water, but since there was no water available new water had to be drawn from a well. While the monk waited, he realized just how inconvenient life was in this area without water. He led the family from the house to the dry riverbank and they dug a hole. He said, "There is water here", and after a short time water gurgled up from that spot. People thought this miracle was an act of grace from Kōbō Daishi and built a well and small hut here. As a result, this spot has been known as Hirai Omizu Daishi (Daishi who dug up water) and people continue to give thanks to him.



Zennyūji Island [Ichiba-cho, Awa city / Yoshinogawa city]

The route from Temple 10, Kirihataji to Temple 11, Fujiidera passes through this island, which is the largest river island in Japan. The land is fertile, so various crops such as Chinese cabbage, cabbage, radish, pumpkin and eggplant are grown here. Canola flowers, sunflowers, spider lilies and cosmos also bloom on this island. The different vegetable fields and flower gardens each have their own color so the island looks like a large patchwork when viewed from a distance. The Kawashima bridge, which is a low water bridge (sensui-kyo), allows people to see the Yoshinogawa river up close.

Azukiarai Daishi [53 Mizutakanaya Donari-cho, Awa city]

In front of Enköji temple, partway between Hörinji and Kirihataji, there is a small hut, which marks the spot of a spring. It is believed that a long time ago, a monk washed some red beans that he had received with the water here. Then he cooked the

beans with rice for dinner. The next morning the monk continued on his journey, but later, a villager came here and was surprised to see that the water was shining red, the same color as the beans. He and others said, "Something amazing has happened. The monk must have been Kōbō Daishi!" From then on, the villagers called this spring "Azukiarai Daishi izumi" (the spring where Daishi washed azuki beans) and have maintained it ever since.
